Ana-Marie Jones, a nationally recognized preparedness trainer and consultant from Oakland, California, will teach a new approach and mindset to emergency preparedness and boost participants' confidence to problem solve with available resources.

Ana-Marie will provide tools and resources specifically created for nonprofits, faith-based groups, and private entities who do not have management infrastructure mandates or plans. Participants will learn how the formal Incident Command System (ICS) can be an easy project management language. Participants will leave feeling empowered to inspire and educate their fellow community members using a shared approach and ready to take a collective leap towards a resilient and prepared community.
